

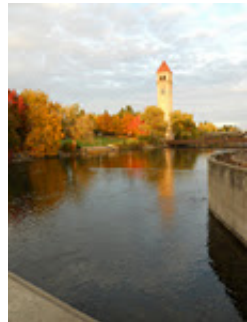
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Tasty Trek

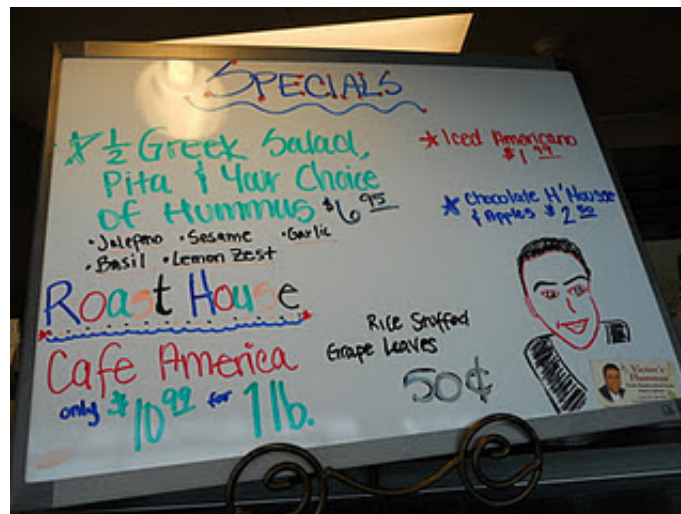

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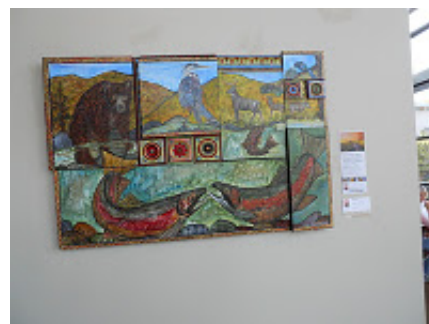

Art in man-made building designs and artistry in nature....

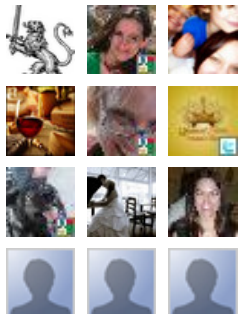
There was even artistry in the food. A man named [Victor Azar](#), who also does catering, manages the Cafe MAC.
